# 33%

OF KINDERGARTEN CHILDREN WERE VULNERABLE IN AT LEAST ONE ASPECT OF THEIR DEVELOPMENT





The **Early Development Instrument** asks kindergarten teachers 104 questions about their students. The tool measures vulnerability on five scales: physical health, and well-being, social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills, and communication skills.

OF GRADE 7 STUDENTS HAVE MEDIUM TO HIGH WELL-BEING OR ARE THRIVING ON THE WELL-BEING INDEX

The **Middle Years Development Index** asks grade 7 students about their experiences inside and outside of school. It measures the percentage of children thriving in five areas of development: physical health and well-being, connectedness, social and emotional development, school experiences, and after school time.

# A SNAPSHOT OF CHILDREN AND FAMILIES IN BURNABY

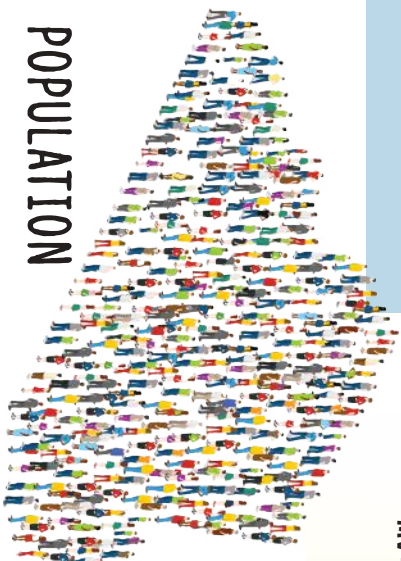

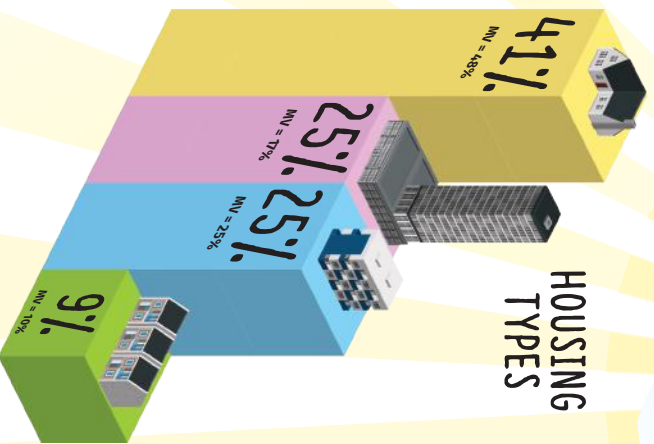
